Rooftop observation deck

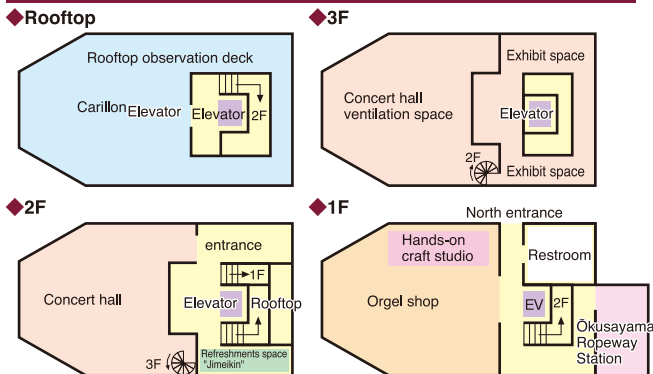
The sound of bells echoes across a 360° view of Lake Hamana.

The point of origin for orgels (music boxes), carillons produce a beautiful sound when their bells are struck.

The instrument installed on the observation deck is a monument to beautiful sound that plays a melody on the hour. Take in the view magnificent 360° view of Lake Hamana before your eyes to further the emotion.

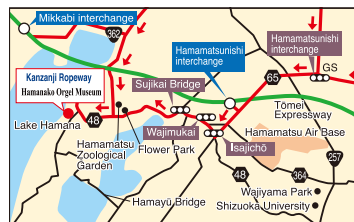

- Approx. 15 minutes by car from the Tōmei Hamamatsunishi interchange to Kanzanji hot springs, or 45 minutes by Entetsu Bus from JR Hamamatsu station.
- When coming by car, please use the Kanzanji Ropeway parking lot. (parking fee: ¥800 *1 car all day)
- *In the event that the Ropeway is closed due to poor weather, etc., visitors will be taken by car to the Ropeway parking lot.



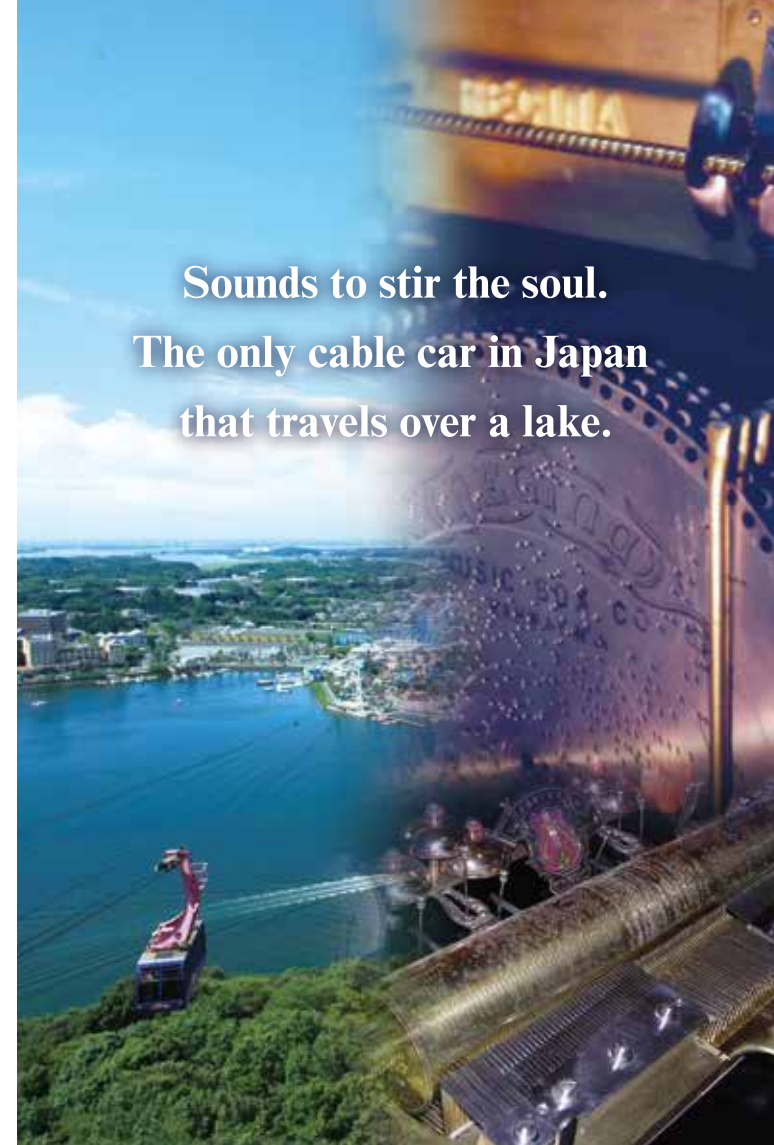
Guide to Hours of Operation

- **Hours of operation: 9 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.**
*Hours of operation change seasonally.
- **No set holidays (service suspended for inspections and maintenance, poor weather)**
- Travel time: 4 minutes one-way · Capacity: 49 people (2 cars)
- When bringing pets, please keep them in a cage big enough to enclose them entirely.

The natural setting of the Hamanako-Kanzanji district and Mt. Ōkusa, plus the Hamanako Orgel Museum presenting a distinctive visage harmonized with the scenery.

A valuable collection is on display in the exhibit spaces that runs from mid-19th century orgels (music boxes) to fairground organs.



Enjoy the beautiful sounds in an airy space with a 6-meter-high ceiling.

Take in the pleasures of the sounds and movements of everything from various orgels (music boxes) to Steinway player pianos, fairground organs, and mechanical dolls in a wonderful acoustic space.

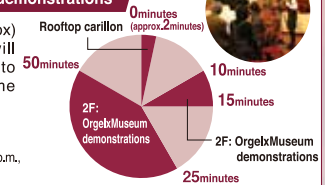
