


## The sound of bells echoes across a 360° view of Lake Hamana.


#### **Guide to Hours of Operationi**

- No set holidays (service suspended for inspections and maintenance, poor weather) Fravel time: 4 minutes one-way Capacity: 49 people (2 cars)

## Some 70 orgels at the same time


